Cocoa producers' associations in Tumaco and Policarpa are set to meet the quality and volume requirements of their customers. The project has invested approximately

USD 140,000 in infrastructure improvements geared towards enhancing the postharvest process in cocoa collection centers. Similarly, lime producers will ensure fruit quality through appropriate handling with the delivery of 3,300 reusable packaging baskets for product transport.

This will be complemented by **improvements**

in associations' tracking and traceability processes through the provision of IT tools and office supplies. **Read more**







Colombia PUEDE aims to improve the quality of life of 2,000 small producers of coconuts, cocoa, and Tahiti lime in the municipalities of Leiva, El Rosario, Policarpa, and Tumaco in the department of Nariño, belonging to the Most Affected Areas by the Armed Conflict (ZOMAC, in Spanish) and Development Plans with a Territorial Approach (PDET, in Spanish).
