## STATEMENT BY MALAYSIA

## 58<sup>TH</sup> SESSION OF THE JOINT ADVISORY GROUP (JAG) OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRADE CENTRE (ITC) TUESDAY, 25 JUNE 2024, 10.00 AM., ROOM W, WTO

Thank you Chair for giving me the floor.

1. It's my great pleasure joining the <u>ITC's 58<sup>th</sup> Joint Advisory Group</u> <u>Meeting</u> today. Based on the <u>reports</u> and information as shared earlier, we would like to <u>congratulate ITC for another productive year in 2023</u>.

2. I would like to take this opportunity to register <u>Malaysia's appreciation</u> on the <u>dedication</u> of the <u>ITC</u> and the <u>European Union</u> for your <u>significant</u> <u>contributions</u> towards in ensuring the <u>successful three-year collaboration</u> of the <u>EU ARISE</u> <u>Plus Malaysia</u> <u>Trade-Related Technical Assistance</u> (TRTA) <u>project</u>, which ended <u>early this year</u>.

3. Special thanks to the <u>ITC's and EU's</u> technical teams for their <u>full</u> <u>cooperation</u> rendered to the <u>Ministry of Investment</u>, <u>Trade and Industry</u> and other domestic stakeholders.

4. On this note, I wish to highlight that <u>various technical assistance and</u> <u>capacity-building programs</u> have <u>benefitted</u> <u>almost 2,400 participants</u> from <u>590 public and private sector institutions</u>. 5. In our <u>assessment</u>, these programmes had <u>given</u> Malaysia the <u>opportunities to work with the experts from ITC and other various EU entities</u> in <u>elevating our trade policies formulation strategies</u>, as well as <u>adopting</u> <u>sustainable production standards</u> and <u>practices</u> in <u>agriculture</u> and <u>fisheries</u> <u>sectors</u>.

- 6. Let me highlight <u>3 success stories</u> of our recent collaboration:
  - Firstly, we conducted a <u>comprehensive review of Malaysia's</u> <u>National Quality Infrastructure</u> which comprise <u>standardisation</u>, <u>metrology</u>, <u>accreditation</u> and <u>conformity assessment</u> to support the development of a National Quality Policy. This review <u>provides a</u> <u>holistic perspective</u> on how the <u>NQI ecosystem could be</u> <u>strengthened</u> to maximise the potential benefits for the country;
  - ii) <u>Secondly</u>, a series of <u>outreach programs</u> to <u>create awareness</u> to our industry and government entities on the <u>EU Green Deal</u> related policies, particularly <u>EUDR</u> and <u>CBAM</u> were conducted. As an outcome of these engagements, Malaysia <u>developed</u> a <u>Mission</u> <u>Report that outlines opportunities and implications</u> on <u>Malaysia</u> <u>Sustainable Trade</u> amid emerging green policies adoption and most importantly as the technical guidance for the industry; <u>and</u>
  - <u>Thirdly</u>, <u>analysis</u> on <u>Latest Trends in Free Trade Agreements</u>: <u>Implications for Malaysia</u>' with the assistance from ITC experts. This serves as a guiding document for Malaysia to assess the gaps between potential FTA partners and Malaysia.

7. We once again would like to <u>express our sincere appreciation</u> for the <u>ITC's</u> and <u>EU's unwavering support</u> during the three-year TRTA project in Malaysia.
